We're excited to share that our product was certified to be 100% Biobased. The label started showing up on certified products during the first quarter of 2015. All biobased amount claims are verified by independent labs and monitored by the USDA. This allows consumers to feel secure in the accuracy of the biobased amount and to be empowered in making more informed purchasing decisions.

But What Is the BioPreferred Program?

The USDA BioPreferred program was created by the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 (2002 Farm Bill), and

expanded by the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (2008 Farm Bill). The purpose is to increase the purchase and use of biobased products. The United States Department of Agriculture manages the program. Products that meet the USDA BioPreferred program requirements carry a distinctive label for easier identification by the consumer.
